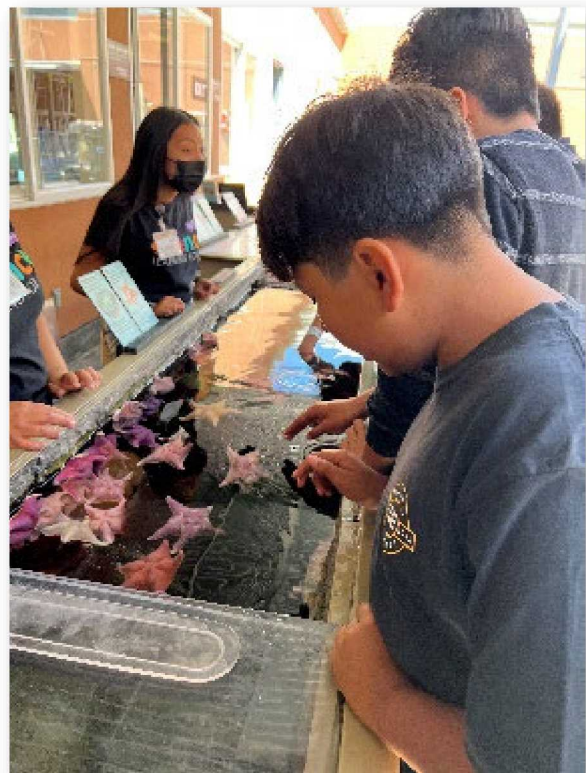

Recreation Programs

Thousand Oaks Teen Center-Summer Camp

The Conejo Valley Unified School District, in partnership with CRPD, planned and executed a successful Summer Camp for 24 CVUSD students. The students were identified by school administrators, school counselors, and Outreach Specialists. Summer Camp consisted of various activities that were not only STEAM-related, but also required teambuilding and critical thinking. In addition, the teens were encouraged to partake in daily physical activities such as kickball, tug of war, dodgeball, and a walk to our local Conejo Community Park.

The Outreach team planned a very exciting and eventful excursion to the California Science Center where the students were able to partake in different activities. The camp took place at the Janss Marketplace as the Teen Center was under renovation.



Reign of Terror

On October 28, 2022, the Youth Outreach team along with other CRPD staff, planned an eventful outing for the teens that live in the Conejo Creek, Los Feliz and Warwick neighborhoods. The outing was a success with 42 teens that attended the event; in addition, the teens had a time of their life with numerous amounts of memories that were made. During the outing the teens had a heart pounding experience when they went through the Reign of Terror Haunted House. When everyone had finished going through the haunted house, pizza and drinks were provided for the teens.



The outing itself was funded through the Safe Passage program.

Bike Program

Youth Outreach program continues to support teens with transportation needs with the Cycle for Success program. This program receives gently used bikes and has them refurbished and made available to teens. Over a span of three months the Youth Outreach team has distributed 10 bikes to Conejo Valley teens, making their commute to school a bit easier. The Youth Outreach program greatly appreciates the donations and our community partners.



Fall Harvest Dance

With the reopening of the Teen Center the Outreach team dedicated some of their time at the local middle schools to do some promotion for the Fall Harvest Dance. On Saturday, November 19, the Teen Center hosted approximately 130 students from the surrounding middle schools for a fun night of dance, games, and food. The teens enjoyed being back at the Teen Center, they played games such as tug of war and freeze dance. The teens were very excited to hear about the reopening of the Teen Center and hosting the dance was a perfect way to reintroduce the teens to the Teen Center.

Community Engagement

Conejo Creek Teen Program

The Conejo Creek Teen Club program continues to meet every Tuesday from 5:00-7:30pm. The teen program thrives within the community with about 40 teens showing up weekly to take part in different activities such as but not limited to: group discussions, problem solving, games, art, crafts, and excursions.

Shadow Oaks Apartments Teen Club Program

The Shadow Oaks Apartments Teen Club program continues to grow interest with the teens living in the Los Feliz area. The program hosts approximately 10-15 participants weekly. Youth Outreach Specialists, Cristal Rodriguez and Luis Sanchez, assist in leading the program each Thursday from 4:00-5:30pm. Activities include group discussions, assistance with schoolwork, group games, arts and crafts, snacks and drinks, and excursions to various venues.
