#### Peace Day

On February 16, Thousand Oaks Community Center hosted a Peace Day Camp for 90 participants from all three Safe Passage sites. This is our third year doing Peace Day with the Rotary Club. The concept is to spread understanding and peace in the community. This year we focused on teamwork, art, music and nature, all referencing peace and unity. There was a scavenger hunt that incorporated team building exercises like how to solve riddles using clues that required brainstorming ways they could help in their communities, schools, home and more. Martin Luther King quotes were also worked into the scavenger hunt. Art Trek provided a dove art project, and brought the "Trek Tones", their in house, education band. They played songs for the kids, and exposed kids to different music from different cultures around the world. #### Elementary Music Program

The spring semester of Elementary Music program has begun. Currently we have 97 Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELOP) registrations. We have provided financial assistance for 64 band and 26 strings families and 93 chorus families. The programs have a total of 392 band students, 268 strings students, and 1,054 chorus students currently enrolled. The chorus programs are learning their own songs or musicals (unique to each school or teacher) as well as 4 songs for the All-District Chorus Festival. The Chorus festival is celebrating 20 years and doing a Broadway theme for the Elementary Music and finale pieces.
