




Perceptions of the District



Hypothetical Two-Thirds Requirement Ballot Title and Measure Summary


(As Approved by Counsel)

Recreation, Park, Natural Area Protection; Emergency/Wildfire Prevention/Response Measure, may read as follows:

To help ensure safe clean parks recreational areas; provide children safe places to play; prevent respond to emergencies wildfires; address homelessness in parks; protect natural areas; prevent pollution entering creeks; shall Conejo Recreation and Park Community Facilities District No.1 Parks, Recreation, Open Space, Safety Services annually levy 2¢ per building square footage, rates and authorized services described in the Rate and Method of Apportionment, be adopted, until ended by voters, with an annual revenue/appropriation limit of \$2,400,000 in the fiscal Year 2023-2024, requiring audits public spending disclosure, funds used locally?



Approximately six-in-ten initially support the measure, with slightly less than three-in-ten having said they would definitely vote yes.








Community Service Program and Infrastructure Priorities


