## Participant Return to Program Protocols Regardless of Vaccination Status

Participant is Identified as a Close Contact	Participant Presents Symptoms <sup>1</sup>	Participant Tests Positive for COVID-19 <sup>2</sup>
<p>Participant may continue attending program if no symptoms are present. It is strongly suggested exposed participants wear a face covering indoors around others for at least 10 days following the date of the last exposure.</p>	<p>Must be excluded from program immediately and testing is highly recommended. May return to program if it has been at least 3 days since symptoms first appeared <b>and</b> there is a negative test on Day 3 or later <b>and</b> free of fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicines <b>and</b> symptoms have significantly improved.</p>	<p>Must be excluded from program for at least 5 days after the start of symptoms (or after date of first positive test if no symptoms).</p>
<p>Exposed participants should get tested within 3-5 days of last known exposure, unless they had COVID-19 within the last 90 days.</p>	<p>If no test is performed participants must be excluded from program for at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared <b>and</b> be free of fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicines <b>and</b> symptoms have significantly improved.</p>	<p>May return to program if there is a negative test on Day 5 or later and if symptoms are resolving/not present. If no test is performed, may return after Day 10 if fever-free for 24 hours without use of fever-reducing medications.</p>
<p>If symptoms develop, participant must stay home and follow protocol for "Participant Presents Symptoms." If positive test, follow protocol for "Participant Tests Positive for COVID-19".</p>	<p>A licensed health care professional may determine a participant may return to the program because the person's symptoms were caused by a known condition other than COVID-19.</p> <p><b>A note from a medical physician is required.</b></p>	<p>If a fever is still present after 10 days, participant may not return until fever resolves</p>

<sup>1</sup> The day symptoms appear is considered Day 0. The following day is considered Day 1.

<sup>2</sup> If asymptomatic and there is a positive test, the day of the positive test is considered Day 0. The following day is considered Day 1.
