

SCOTT BUCHANAN

Scott Buchanan, during his 36-year career at CRPD, helped evolve the Cultural Unit into a nationally recognized and award-winning theater program. Under his leadership, Buchanan was instrumental in coordinating acting classes, youth theatre, and the Teen Summer

Musical to create the Young Artists Ensemble (YAE). He helped to instill a love for the arts in the youth of our community that continues to grow and blossom throughout their lives.

In 2005, he initiated a collaboration between YAE and CRPD's Therapeutic Recreation Unit, featuring disabled and non-disabled performers collaborating to provide a unique theatre experience on stage. Buchanan's passion for the arts also prompted him to assist in preserving music programs in elementary schools by administering the Elementary Music Programs within the Conejo Valley Unified School District. His remarkable and enduring career make Buchanan a "natural" to receive this honor.

SUSAN HOLT

Susan Holt, former member of the CRPD Board of Directors, was first elected to the Board in 1994. Before her retirement in 2022, she was reelected for six terms and was chair of the Board five times. During her 28 years

BRYAN MCQUEENEY

Bryan McQueeney is CEO and co-founder of Ride On Therapeutic Horsemanship, a local non-profit that teaches adaptive horseback riding to children and adults with physical and cognitive disabilities. McQueeney's interest in therapeutic horsemanship was developed after meeting his wife Gloria, in 1984, and being inspired by her own

work in this field. As time went on, he became an equestrian and open space advocate, writing letters and appearing before the City and County of Los Angeles, as well as for the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, urging the protection of open space and trails. Ride On began on a 2-acre leased property in Chatsworth. Bryan's partnership with CRPD began in 2001, when, working together, the Walnut Grove Equestrian Center was developed. McQueeney's commitment to public service was further enhanced when he agreed to step in and manage the Rancho Potrero Community Equestrian Center in Newbury Park. With over 37 years of therapeutic riding experience, McQueeney continues to provide programs and services through Ride On that improve lives and leaves a lasting impact on those who participate. He serves in other capacities with groups such as CLU's Center for Nonprofit Leadership, Play Conejo, Special Olympics, and works as an advisor to therapeutic riding centers around the country. His hard work and devotion to the community he serves makes this recognition very well-deserved.
