ADULT CARE CENTERS

Assist seniors by engaging them in activities: walking, dancing, music programs, companionship, arts and crafts, games and more; assist as a front desk receptionist, provide clerical support, and other opportunities.

AMERICA SUPPORTING AMERICANS (ASA)

Help support our troops! Volunteers needed for sending out packages, writing cards, helping with newsletter, website, special events, & board positions.

CANCER SUPPORT COMMUNITY

Offers free programs that provide psychological, social, and emotional support for cancer patients and their families. Volunteer for clerical and receptionist tasks at their Westlake office.

CHUMASH INDIAN MUSEUM

Volunteer opportunities include school tour assistants, gift shop associates, handy-work help, and more.

CONEJO FREE CLINIC

Receptionists, data entry assistants, doctors, nurses, dentists, and lawyers to work with the low-income and homeless population.

CONEJO OPEN SPACE FOUNDATION/NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

Educates patrons about their roles as custodians and protectors of our open space and the environment. Volunteers needed for Adopt-a-Trail, Trail Patrol, Trail Watch, Trail Building, Trail Maintenance, and Trail Education Days. Volunteers needed at Visitor Centers.

CONEJO VALLEY ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM

Tutor adults in reading and writing at the Conejo Valley Adult School Literacy Center. Volunteers and students are matched and meet weekly. Training workshops are held throughout the year.

CONEJO VALLEY BOTANIC GARDENS

Plant, prune, learn to propagate plants, or conduct tours for school children and adults. Our local botanic garden, located at Conejo Community Park, is maintained and managed by volunteers who set their own schedules.

CONEJO VALLEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Make a difference in the life of a child!

If you have an hour or two a week to spend in the classroom to help children (under the direction of the teacher), you can give an extra boost to a child's learning experience.

CONEJO VALLEY VILLAGE (CVV)

Provide services to help older adults stay in their homes. Drivers needed to provide rides for medical appointments and other local errands. Volunteers to help with household support, electronics set-up, and more.

COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES (CASA)

A CASA Volunteer is a trained community volunteer appointed by a juvenile court judge to speak for the best interests of a child or non minor dependent who has been abused or neglected.

Non-advocate opportunities also available.

FOOD PANTRY PROGRAMS

Work at food pantry collecting and distributing food/produce to families in and around the Conejo Valley.

GARDENS OF THE WORLD

Rewarding volunteer opportunities in a beautiful garden setting. Docents are trained to lead educational tours.

GOEBEL ADULT COMMUNITY CENTER

Array of opportunities include front desk, blood pressure, Goebel Cafe, CSVP Boutique, Saturday night dances, mailings, tax greeters, and more!

HEALTH INSURANCE COUNSELING AND ADVOCACY PROGRAM (HICAP)

After receiving extensive training and additional internship hours, volunteers are certified to provide free counseling to Medicare recipients relating to Medicare, Medicare Advantage plans, long-term care insurance, and prescription drug coverage.

HOSPICE OF THE CONEJO

Hospice volunteers are special people!
Some work directly with terminally ill patients and their families to provide emotional support, companionship, and respite care. Other volunteers help with the Tree of Life as well as other special events throughout the year.

JAMES STOREHOUSE

Support children in foster care and those aging-out by providing resources that will ease transitions and improve living conditions. Opportunities include organizing donations, delivering goods, helping shop, marketing, and fundraising.

LONG TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN

As advocates for the elderly, these volunteers visit, observe, advise, protect, and help solve problems in long term care facilities in Ventura County. Excellent training is provided.

MANY MANSIONS

This non-profit, affordable housing provider has on-site services to help residents break the cycle of poverty. Various volunteer opportunities including receptionist, filing, fundraising, event planning, and more.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Drivers are needed to deliver meals to Meals on Wheels clients. Help older adults who are unable to drive or cook for themselves.

MEDICAL CENTERS

Interest, compassion, and caring are the attributes you need to volunteer at a local healthcare facility.

Meet people, learn new skills, and help your community!

PET PROGRAMS

Do you love dogs? Local agencies are looking for volunteers to walk dogs, sit with dogs, fold laundry, answer phones, and organize supplies.

SCHOOL ON WHEELS

Provides academic tutoring to children living in shelters, motels, vehicles, group foster homes, and on the streets. Services for students grades K-12. Volunteer today and become a positive role model and mentor in the life of a child.

Volunteer at your local library today. Numerous opportunities including tutoring programs, book sorting, book displays, and more.

THRIFT SHOPS

Several local thrift shops can use your help sorting, pricing, or assisting as a cashier. Thrift shops raise funds for local nonprofit organizations.

VOLUNTEERS IN POLICING (VIP)

Volunteers perform routine police functions allowing deputies to concentrate on the duties that sworn personnel can perform.

WESTMINSTER FREE CLINIC

This non-profit organization provides basic health care to homeless and low-income population. Physicians, nurses, dentists, and other health care professionals are needed on Wednesday evenings.
